ELECT NEW MEMBERS ON THE Gwynedd Council Liaison / Scrutiny Working Groups

It's time once more to elect 7 new members to the Gwynedd Council and Voluntary Sector Liaison Group. For the first time this year the members elected will have the opportunity to take part in Scrutiny Committee working groups. We are keen to maximise the voluntary sector's input into policy discussions especially the more in-depth work carried out in the Improvement Working Groups.

We are therefore looking for people able to represent the voluntary sector and scrutinise the following fields:

- **Care**

Includes housing and homeless, care of the elderly, disabled, mental health, welfare rights and carers
- *at least 2 representatives*

- **Environment**

Includes planning, waste, transport and environment
- *at least 1 representative*

- **Development**

Includes economy and regeneration, life long learning, arts, museums and sport
- *at least 2 representatives*

- **Children and Young People**

Includes social work, education and youth

- *at least 1 representative*

- **Resources**

Estate, public protection, licensing, e.government, procurement
- *at least 1 representative*

We would not expect the representative to be present in all the Scrutiny committees regularly but this is an opportunity to input the Improvement working groups (where the in depth discussions take place) The voluntary sector member would be an expert witness able to provide invaluable input into the specific area of discussion.

We hope that this arrangement will enable the Sector to express its views at the start of the planning process. Training and travel allowance will be provided for this work

'Creating Volunteer Roles that Excite and Motivate'.

The Gwynedd Volunteers' Organisers Network meets regularly three times a year, and the first meeting of 2007 was a volunteering workshop led by Adam May. The title of the Workshop was 'Creating Volunteer Roles that excite and motivate' with the aim of helping Volunteer Managers to recruit, retain and motivate volunteers.

During the workshop, the following points were discussed:

- i) 'Volunteer Role descriptions'.
- ii) Motivating Volunteers - In general, people are motivated by:
 - Affiliation - or social contact
 - Autonomy - or the desire to be independent
 - Achievement - the desire to have something to show for their volunteering.
- iii) 'Role enrichment and role enlargement'. A good way is to involve volunteers themselves in developing their role - this will help them to feel that their expertise and views are valued.
- iv) The changing patterns of volunteering - increasing numbers of people want to volunteer for specific, time limited, project-based activities rather than make a regular open-ended, ongoing commitment.
